"A cord of three strands is not easily broken."

**Ecclesiastes 4:12** 

When a woman contacts Lifehouse it is often because she feels hopeless and broken. Her relationship with family or friends is strained or non-existent. She has nowhere else to turn. She is hurting, feels unsafe, and believes she can no longer do this alone. She is seeking something to grab onto – a lifeline.

Ecclesiastes 4:12 reminds us that "a cord of three strands is not easily broken." Three elements—woven together—offer strength far greater than one or two alone. At Lifehouse, this three-strand cord becomes a powerful metaphor for the lifeline we extend to moms in crisis: your faithful partnership, the transformative Lifepath program, the unshakable hope of Christ.

United, these strands create a bond strong enough to lift a mother from despair to a new life braided with hope, courage, and stability.

#### You are are critical strand.

Your partnership is a critical strand in this cord. Right now,

**Neve\*** came to us after an accident totaled her home – the car where she and her infant son slept. A shelter offered temporary safety, but it wasn't enough for a child. Now at Lifehouse, Neve has a job, a warm bed for her and her baby, and fierce determination to build a better life.

Lauren\* will graduate from nursing school this Spring. After rehab, she and her son found stability at Lifehouse, where she now lives in a Phase Two transitional unit. She'll start working as an OR nurse in June, saving for a home while dreaming of moving closer to family in Georgia. Lauren sees God's hand in leading her to Lifehouse, grateful for a fresh start.

# The Lord Leads and Equips

Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves. A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.

Ecclesiastes 4:12

In early March, I celebrated six years as part of the Lifehouse family. It's hard to believe how quickly time has passed since my second day on the job, when I came home and told my husband, "God picked the wrong person for this." That afternoon, I'd sat in on my first interview with a prospective program participant—a seventeen-year-old girl who had endured unimaginable trauma and abuse from family, foster homes, and group homes. Yet there she was, determined to keep her baby and give it the love she'd never known.

Listening to her story broke my heart, and I still don't know how I kept my composure. That day taught me a profound lesson: God doesn't always call the equipped, but He equips those He calls. Six years later, I'm still leaning on Him to guide and teach me.

#### **The Changing Struggles of Our Moms**

Over these six years, the stories and struggles of Lifehouse moms have evolved. When I started, most of the pregnant women reaching out to us were battling addiction or seeking recovery, desperate for help to get sober. We'd connect them with treatment centers, promising a bed at Lifehouse once they were on the path to healing. Then came COVID—a challenge unlike anything we'd faced. Jobs disappeared, daycares shuttered, and

keeping everyone healthy in a shared living space felt like an uphill battle.

Today, our biggest hurdles look different. Many of the women we serve are housing insecure or homeless, unable to afford skyrocketing rents. Another pressing issue is safe, reliable childcare. Post-COVID, numerous daycare centers have never reopened, and many others have since closed. On top of that, the current generation of Lifehouse moms—shaped by past trauma, cultural influences, or lingering fears from the pandemic hesitate to entrust their children to strangers. Whatever the root, we've recognized a critical truth: for these moms to achieve sustainable stability, they need to work, and to work, they need a place where they feel their children are secure.

This realization spurred Lifehouse leadership into action. Over the past year, we explored off-site childcare options, researched licensing requirements, and calculated renovation costs. After careful consideration, we concluded the most feasible option is childcare must happen on-site at Lifehouse.

#### From Need to Vision to Reality

To make this vision a reality, we've mapped out the necessary steps. For safety, an additional staircase needs to

be added to the lower level, where the childcare space will be located. Security cameras and recording equipment need to be installed to ensure everyone's safety. The space will need supplies and we will hire additional staff to care for the children of our participants. This new **Child Life**Center will be a haven—overflowing with love, laughter, learning, and Jesus. We'll read Bible stories, sing "Jesus Loves Me," and share God's love with children of all ages, free from restrictions.

the workbook's title that was utilized
throughout the course, along with
scripture breakdown, practical videos, and
weekly group prayer/reflection time.

The course was highly impactful as we strive to lead participants by being an example.

Alle is now implementing one of the Compass workbooks, "Making Ends Meet" with participants in case

management sessions.

The Compass workbooks are filled with helpful templates, open discussion questions and short videos related to each chapter. This is a great way to expose participants to financial principles that have proven to be successful and engage participants in their own ideas about managing finances.

Program participants had the opportunity to meet Dr. Jane Grant, PT, DPT. Dr. Grant is a pelvic health specialist, full-spectrum doula, and holistic professional. She specializes in pelvic floor rehabilitation, sexual wellness, and pregnancy and postpartum mobility.

Known for her integrative approach, Dr. Grant combines traditional physical therapy with a variety of holistic modalities, including herbalism, somatic healing, and mindfulness, to address the full spectrum of pelvic health and reproductive wellness. As the owner of Invigorate Holistic Wellness, she uses education, accessible wellness solutions, and advocacy to help her patients take control of their health and thrive at all stages of their reproductive health journeys.

Dr. Grant led an interactive session and presentation on pelvic health for expecting and postpartum mothers. She provided information related to the female anatomy, prenatal and postpartum exercise coaching, and practical ways to maintain pelvic health. Participants enjoyed practicing different pelvic exercises, engaging in open discussion,

and gaining knowledge about their pelvic health.

### Lifehouse Staff attends Educational Conference

Lifehouse Program Director, Shannon, Case Manager, Alle, and CEO, Dolli attended the first annual National Christian Conference on Sexual Exploitation held in Louisville. This conference provided education on human trafficking, focusing on recovery, trauma-informed care, residential programming, and more. Lifehouse continues to receive calls and serve trafficking survivors. Lifehouse also recently became a member of the Kentucky Secretary of State's Businesses Against Trafficking initiative. Lifehouse is committed to providing the appropriate care and support for women and children who have survived this horrific trauma.

When she left after the birth of her first child, Deena returned to an unhealthy living situation—but Lifehouse welcomed her back with grace when she reached out again, pregnant a second time. Today, Deena's safe, improving her English, earning her diploma, and watching her children thrive.
